


Cancer patients waiting less than 31 days for first treatment



Patients admitted, discharged or transferred from ED within 6 hrs (Shorter Stays in ED)



Patients waiting less than 4 months for first specialist assessment at end of each quarter shown




People waiting end of Q1 24/25

Patients waiting less than 4 months for treatment at end of each quarter shown


